

Perch Base monthly income mostly comes from the purchases that base members make at the Base Store or the "earned" funds from our 50/50 raffle. However, our biggest funding for the year is the donations received from members. While most donations are received during the Membership Drive that will start in October, you can donate to the base at any time throughout the year.

Our base has added the ability to accept credit and debit cards for store purchases, membership fees, and donations. Currently, we only accept these types of payments when the card and purchaser are present so you will need to be at a Base meeting to use this. We will soon be upgrading the card reader to accept chipped cards so that we help limit liability and minimize potential fraud through acceptance of these cards. With this tool, we are moving into the 21st Century for payment methods. If you are interested in using another method of payment such as PayPal, Android Pay, Apple Pay, or other method, please let a Board member know of your preference and we will research if these methods are worthwhile pursuing.


During the past quarter, our PERCH BASE WEBSITE page views were about 5,468. About 32% of that traffic is from within Arizona, so I will assume that is from YOU.

Anyone can view the website. However, our Perch Base, United States Submarine Veterans Inc. Facebook Group, unlike the website, has limited access to Perch Base members only. New Perch Base members are invited to join. Existing members who are not already in the Facebook group can ask the Webmaster to be invited. Because of the increased privacy, members can discuss personal matters, such as the Binnacle List, and can post their own comments, such as Glenn Posniack's post that he visited Walt Blomgren at the hospital.

The PERCH BASE WEBSITE is an integral part of our newsletter communication. The OTHER Perch

When we discuss our USSVI Base namesake, the USS Perch, we tend to relate to SS-176, which went on Eternal Patrol on March 3, 1942 with six men lost as POWs. Some of you might not be aware that a second USS Perch (SS-313) was commissioned on January 7, 1944, and completed seven war patrols in the Pacific involving action with both Japanese merchant ships and warships, including taking some severe depth charging. She also conducted lifeguard duty for fighters and bombers returning from raids in Japan and some commando activities ashore prior to the end of WW2.

Later, she was converted to a troop transport, including dropping a force of British Commandos in a successful raid on a train tunnel that earned Lieutenant Commander R. D. Quinn the Bronze Star, the only submarine commanding officer to receive a combat award during the Korean War. She also participated in numerous reconnaissance, search and rescue operations, and amphibious landings during the war in Vietnam.

I had the honor of discussing the USS Perch (SS-313) with Allen Dahmer, a retired Chief Signalman, who participated as a Beachmaster during some of her transport training activities in Hawaii and Alaska in 1956 and 1957. He shared a news article with photos of the Marine platoon in the boat. Diesel boats are cramped with the normal crew, but she carried both the crew and the platoon. I thought hot bunking was tough on my nuke boat! She also commonly had a large hanger on her aft deck that could carry amphibious boats or a helicopter, similar to what you now see on the new generation submarines when carrying special forces. I wonder if the Marines knew that the diesel boat coffee pots were hardpiped into the sanitary tank. The old submariners always told me that backleakage while blowing san tanks is what made the coffee “special.”

Allen also discussed his cousin Dennis Gilbert, TM2(SS), who served on the Batfish (SS-310), Sennet (SS-408), Chivo (SS-341), Picuda (SS-382), Abraham Lincoln (SSBN-602), and the Entemedor (SS-340). Dennis was a member of the Redfish Base USSVI in Slidell, LA and passed on Eternal Patrol on March 28, 2014. “Sailor, rest your oar, we have the watch.”



OUT OF THE HATCH—As soon as the Perch surfaced, Navy crewmen and Marines emerged from the forward and conning-tower hatches, inflating the fibre boats, stowing the light gear and launching them. As soon as the hatches were battened down, the sub would dive again. In this picture, the reconns are practicing speed in getting out of the forward hatch. In the background, Navy crewmen are inflating the boats. Many speed trials were run, cutting down appreciably the time that the sub was above the surface.



TIGHT QUARTERS—The USS Perch is one of two troop-carrying submarines in the Navy. As the above picture shows, the troops and the crew that she carries, of necessity, live in tight quarters. The members of the reconnaissance platoon shared forward and midships sleeping quarters with members of the crew. Working during the day and at night the reconns did not spend too much time in their berthing spaces. When they were there, they spent a lot of time swapping sea stories with the Navy crewmen.



THAT OLD BLACK MAGIC, COFFEE! — The Navy crewmen found able competitors in the Marine amphibians as far as coffee drinking was concerned. In this picture PFC Kenneth V. Esso helps himself to a piping hot cup after two hours of night work in the choppy surf area of Makaha beach. Between meals the galley was the meeting place for coffee and snacks, one of the highlights of submarine life. The reconns never tasted food to equal the dolphin's fare. Although one man went on mess duty each day, the reconns would have been satisfied to stay on the Perch for months as far as chow was concerned.

COLD WAR RECOGNITION CERTIFICATE

Anyone who served from Sept. 2, 1945 through Dec. 26, 1991 is eligible to receive a Cold War Recognition Certificate. Listed below is the information necessary to apply along with the required documentation:

- The easiest way to apply is via the internet at <http://coldwar.army.mil>.
- If you do not have access to the internet you can mail the documents to CWRS, 4035 Ridgetop Road, Fairfax, VA 22030-7445 or fax the information to 1-800-723-9262.
- Documentation required:
 - The name of the recipient.
 - Social Security Number, Military Service Number, or Foreign Service Number.
 - Dates of Service.
 - Some examples of acceptable documents are:
 - LES for military
 - DD-214
 - Travel Orders
 - You must send documentation even if you are still active duty military or a government employee.
 - SEND COPIES ONLY! No documents will be returned. The copy does not require notarization.
- Your certificate will arrive approximately 20 weeks after approval.
- Only one certificate per person. This certificate will only have the name of the recipient, no rank or title.
- All privacy act data will be used ONLY for the purpose of identification of eligibility. Documents will be handled with care and destroyed as soon as practical.
- DO NOT SEND MONEY
- No associated medal has been authorized or issued at this time.
- You can request this certificate on behalf of a relative (living or deceased).


