The membership renewal drive is also underway along with the requests for donations to Perch Base. Please renew your membership and be generous with your donations to the base.



Currently we have 179 members in Perch Base. We are again doing well with our current members getting prospective members to join. All our members who actively participate in the recruiting function of the Perch Base can equally benefit from bringing in new members. If you have not forgotten, if you sponsor a new member and he/she makes it through the membership process, the Base will buy your lunch at the next monthly meeting. If you bring someone in and he/she makes it through the process, make sure you indicate on his application that you are his sponsor, so I can notify David Heighway, the Base Treasurer. Remember, the prospective new member must complete the entire membership process for the sponsor to get credit.

Now let's get down to business. As I mentioned on the September 8, 2018, we are about to start our annual membership renewal drive for 2019. Since the last newsletter, I have added Perch Base Scholarship photos at the August Monthly meeting, George Crider Eternal Patrol, Cisco Systems sponsorship of the USS Cisco at the ASSM Memorial, the Perch Base Birthday cake celebration at the June Monthly meeting, pictures of the USS Phoenix crew reunion, the Prescott Frontier Days parade photos, photos and rubbings of the Vietnam Moving Wall Memorial displayed in Surprise, a promotion for the Boat Sponsorship Program and updates to the Float Maintenance page.

During the past 3 months, there were approximately 3,347 page views on the Perch Base website during 1,427 sessions by 967 users based on Google Analytics. The new statistic shows that 14% of the traffic are returning visitors and the other 86% are new visitors to the website. Approximately 64% of the sessions originated in the US and the remainder were widely scattered around the world. Approximately 28% of the U.S. sessions were from locations in the Metro Phoenix area, which is assumed to come from our local membership.

#### Navy will pay big bucks to retain senior sub officers

The Navy is offering bonuses worth up to \$180,000 to help keep senior officers in the submarine fleet.

"The purpose of the change to the nuclear officer bonus and incentive pay is to retain the service and experience of our senior submariners as our fleet continues to grow," said Lt. Rick Moore, a spokesman for the <a href="Chief of Naval Personnel">Chief of Naval Personnel</a>.

"We only want to keep senior major commanders, whose skill and expertise in the submarine community will help train the next generation of leaders, but we want to encourage new officers to join the nuclear propulsion training program." Major commands include helming <u>guided-missile submarines</u>, sub squadrons or task forces; overseeing submarine training, maintenance or tenders; plus commanding submarine bases, Moore said.

Beginning Oct. 1, sub officers who have served in major command and have accrued more than 26 years of commissioned service will be eligible for annual bonuses of between \$35,000 and \$45,000.

For an officer now in a major command or who has finished a tour, inking a one-year Nuclear Officer Continuation Bonus contract will add an extra \$35,000.




# Sage Words of Wisdom . . .

# Swimming crooks stole from NJ submarine that someone sank, cops say

Two people from Connecticut have been charged with swimming through the Hackensack River before burglarizing a historic submarine that someone else had previously sunk this year.

Jon P. Stevens, of West Haven, Connecticut, and Laura Palmese, of Colchester, Connecticut, have been charged with stealing a lantern and a Medical Corps Lieutenant Shoulder lapel from the USS Ling on August 11.

Police released pictures of the two inside the flooded submarine with lights attached to their heads. The pair are believed to have parked at a nearby diner and swam to the submarine before taking the items, police said.

Last month, police announced that a caretaker of the USS Ling/Naval Museum reported four bronze plaques were stolen from the property, and that in another incident an unknown person had entered the submarine and opened "numerous hatches" inside, causing the submarine to take on water.

The charges announced on Thursday are not connected to the flooding and damage to the submarine. The pair are expected to appear in court for the first time on October 1.

The Ling served during World War II and has been in Hackensack since the 1970's, according to a GoFundMe has been established to help pay for repairs to the submarine. It was closed for repairs after Super Storm Sandy and has been closed to the public since 2015 because of damage to the pier. The fundraising effort started 15 months ago and has raised more than \$24,000 out of a goal of \$100,000.

### Scholarship Presentation







### Thank You Shipmates and Friends

One of the fundraising promotions we started for the *Arizona Silent Service Memorial* project was the Lost Boat Sponsorship Program which was launched in August 2015. For a \$500 donation, individuals, businesses and veteran's organizations could sponsor one of the 65 U.S. Navy submarines that we have lost since the inception of the Submarine Service in 1900.

We first contacted USSVI bases around the country who that are named for Lost Boats as we wanted these bases to have the first opportunity to sponsor their namesake boats. That same month, on August 15, 2015, we received the first \$500 Lost Boat Sponsorship check from Bob Sommer, Treasurer for the USSVI Tang Base in Pinellas Park, FL. This was for the Memorial Sponsorship of the USS Tang SS-306 which was lost on 25 Oct 1944. This past August 13, 2018 almost three years later to the day, we received the final \$500 Lost Boat Sponsorship check from Curtis Grant on behalf of the USSVI Twin Lakes Base in Mountain Home, AR. This was for the Memorial Sponsorship of the USS S-51 SS-162 lost on 25 Sep 1925.

We are extremely grateful to all the individuals, businesses and veteran's organizations who have contributed to this worthy cause. They will all be duly recognized at the memorial site in Wesley Bolin Plaza, in front of the State Capitol Building in Phoenix, AZ.
