
From "Snipes Castle":

So, whom among us were party too or a victim of this prank?




















UNDERSEA WARFARE NEWS



The "Novosibirsk" arrives at the Pacific Fleet's base Vilyuchinsk at the Kamchatka Peninsula on Russia's Pacific coast.

Nuclear subs made trans-Arctic under-ice transfer from Barents to Pacific

Two of Russia's newest nuclear-powered submarines have completed a 5,500 nm voyage under the Arctic ice cap.

Built at Sevmash shipyard in Severodvinsk and tested in the White- and Barents Seas, the two submarines "*Novosibirsk*" and "*Knyaz Oleg*" are now ready for combat patrols.

The inter-fleet transit from the Northern Fleet to the Pacific Fleet contributes to a substantial strength of the submarine forces in the Russian Far East. *"Knyaz Oleg"* of the Borey-class carries 16 ballistic nuclear missiles, while the *"Novosibirsk"* is armed with some of the navy's most modern long-range cruise missiles, torpedoes and mines.

Both submarines participated in the Umka-2022 naval exercise taking place in the Chucki Sea now in September before sailing into Vilyuchinsk naval base near Petropavlovsk-Kamchatskiy this week, the Defense Ministry <u>informs</u>.

There are now three Borei-class ballistic missile submarines in active service with the Pacific Fleet. The *"Novosibirsk"* is the first 4th generation Yasen-class multi-purpose sub to be deployed in the Pacific.

GILBERT VETERANS CEREMONY:

Three Perch Base members attended the 2022 Town of Gilbert, AZ Veterans Day Ceremony on November 10, 2022, at the Gilbert Regional Park.

Although we did not display the USS Phoenix (SSN-702), the USS Arizona Legacy Foundation for the future submarine USS Arizona (SSN-803) had a display table at the ceremony. There will be Keel Laying Viewing Ceremony (via ZOOM) at the Town of Gilbert Public Safety Training Facility on December 7, 2022. The ceremony included a Keynote speech by Congressional Medal of Honor recipient Major General Patrick Brady (ret). Major General (then Major Brady) flew over 2,000 combat missions in Vietnam and evacuated more than 5,000 wounded.



USS ARIZONA (SSN-803) KEEL LAYING CEREMONY:

Five Perch Base members attended the USS Arizona (SSN-803) Keel Laying Ceremony on December 7, 2022 at the Gilbert (AZ) Public Safety Training Facility. The *"real"* ceremony was held at the General Dynamics Electric Boat Shipyard at Quonset Point, Rhode Island, and transmitted via ZOOM to the Gilbert Public Safety facility. (apologies, in advance, because photos of a ZOOM call broadcast to a large screen lack clarity!)

The "star" of the show was the USS Arizona (SSN-803) sponsor, Ms. Nikki Stratton. Nikki's grandfather, Don Stratton, was a survivor of the USS Arizona (BB-39) following the Pearl Harbor attack on December 7, 1941. Sadly, Don passed on February 15, 2020. At that time, Don was one of only 3 survivors; the remaining two, Lou Conter & Ken Potts participated in the ZOOM call. It was at Don's funeral that the Acting Secretary of the Navy Thomas Modly asked Nikki to be the USS Arizona (SSN-803) sponsor, a role commonly reserved for wives of Presidents.

In keeping with maritime tradition, the initials of the ship's sponsor are welded onto a steel plate that will be incorporated into the ship as it is built. The welding is usually performed by a welder, but in this case, Nikki (who learned how to weld!) performed part of the initials herself.

Other Arizonans present at Quonset Point for the Keel Laying Ceremony included Gilbert Mayor Honorable Brigette Peterson, Gilbert Veterans Advisory Board Liaison Pamela Rinesmith and Bill Spence. Bill retired as a Lieutenant Commander Nuclear Engineering Officer, served on seven submarines and two aircraft carriers and is actively involved in the Gilbert veteran's community. Gilbert, AZ, is the city sponsor for the USS Arizona (SSN-803).

JIM ANDREWS' HONOR FLIGHT:

Congratulations to Perch Base Submarine Veteran (USSVI) Jim Andrews who was selected for an Honor Flight to Washington, DC, in October 2022.

Honor Flight Arizona took its first flight of 11 WWII Veterans in November 2009 and has now flown a total of more than 2,400 WWII, Korean War, and Vietnam War Veterans. Trips have also included over 1,600 guardians assisting the Veterans along the way. They also have a base of many active volunteers. They encourage Veterans from WWII, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War to sign up for their no-cost Honor Flight.

Honor Flight Arizona is part of the nationwide Honor Flight Network. Both are 501(c)3 nonprofit organizations able to do the great work they do because of generous private donations and corporate support.

Mike joined the United States Submarine Service Veterans, Inc. (USSVI) on September 1, 2003, at the Base 51 in Las Vegas, Nevada, then later moved to Surprise, Arizona and joined our Perch Base on February 8, 2014.

To no surprise, Mike became our Base Chaplain in November 2015. He could be counted on to visit ill members, conduct Eternal Patrol services, provide counselling to families and help members to obtain benefits. Mike was so committed to his role as Chaplain, he became the Chaplain at the Maricopa County Jail for the Veteran's unit. Even after he turned over the Base Chaplain role in October 2017, he still routinely would lead invocations and benedictions when the new Chaplain was not present. Mike routinely attended meetings and was a Base Operations Supporter donating monies or efforts to allow for Base operations while keeping our dues low and avoid raising money through member labor as most other organizations do.







