Webmaster – Dan Marks

Major activity with the website since the last BOD meeting included posting the Emil Schoonejans Eternal Patrol Notice and the Prescott Frontier Days® Rodeo Parade..

Routine updates during the past month included updating the Sailing Orders page, Flash Traffics, base correspondence and meeting minutes uploaded, Lost Boat notices and Half Staff notices posted and links updated. Similar updates have been maintained on the Perch Base Facebook Page.

During June, there were 702 page views on the Perch Base website during 387 sessions by 264 users based on Google Analytics. These numbers are slightly lower than usual. During the month, approximately 79% of the sessions originated in the US, 2% from China and the remainder were widely scattered around the world. Approximately 20% of the U.S. based sessions were from locations in Arizona, which is assumed to come from our membership. Most of the traffic was to the home page (39%), followed by the Glossary (14%), Sailing Orders (13%,) the Emil Schoonejans Eternal Patrol Page (4%,) the Eternal Patrol page (3%), and the Memorial Day Ceremony (2%).

During June, the Facebook Post Reach (The number of people who saw any of our posts at least once. Reach is different from impressions, which may include multiple views of your posts by the same people.) was 9,205. The Facebook Post Engagement (The number of reactions, comments, shares and clicks on your posts) was 369. Our Facebook page had 4 new Page Likes for a total of 166 and 9 new Follows for a total of 189 Followers. These numbers are a significant increase. The top post was "WWII Veteran Emil Joseph Schoonejans, TM2(SS) ETERNAL PATROL World War 2 submarine veteran, Holland Club member and Perch Base Life . . ." with 88 Post Impressions, a Post Reach of 85, and a Post Engagement of 12.

Dennis Ottley emphasized that this also ensures receipt of notifications from the National USSVI organization.
