THIS AIN'T NO S#IT: DAN MARKS AND THE U.S. MARINES ARE EVEN, NOW!

I was flying from Phoenix, AZ to San Jose, CA to visit my Brother-in-Law in Gilroy, CA, *"The Garlic Capital of the World."* As I boarded the flight, the flight attendant greeting the passengers saw I was wearing my USS RAY (SSN-653) ballcap and instead of the usual "Welcome Aboard," he said, "I need to talk to you when we get settled."

The flight attendants completed their usual safety instructions, served refreshments after takeoff, and shortly later the same flight attendant came to my seat. He said that his squad of Marines were aboard the USS Ray for an action in 1977. I served on the USS Ray, my qual boat from 1974 to 1978 and I remembered the Marines on board! They spent their entire time in the torpedo room, cleaning their weapons. I don't recall that they ever left the torpedo room, except to use the head. They didn't even come to mess deck, eating their K-rations, instead. They were on-board for several days and then in the dark of the night we surfaced, they exited the boat, inflated their rubber rafts, and that was the last we ever saw of the Marines.

I was a Nuke, so my job was to push the boat wherever we needed to go. To this day, I don't know where we were when the Marines disembarked. As my plane landed, the flight attendant was at the exit saying "bye-bye" to the passengers.

I told him, "I gave you a ride years ago. You gave me a ride today. I guess we're even now!"

A Boat Reunion

Back in mid October, I attended a reunion of sorts with my shipmates who were assigned to the USS Sculpin (SSN-590) in Bremerton, WA. This event focused on those who had served on the Sculpin in the 70's and early 80's. The Sculpin was my qual boat (April, 1974); therefore, it had a special standing in my naval service. There are a number of Perch Base members who also served on the Sculpin as it had a long and distinguished career. I would expect that some of you have, at one time or another, also attended a Sculpin reunion. Having done so in the past, these events can be very formal or more casual. This reunion was of the later.

There were some Sculpin veterans who lived in the Bremerton area. They stepped forward to arrange for a special rate at a local hotel and a meeting room for all of the reunion participants to hook up and renew those relationships of long ago. Also, the local team made sure that the meeting room was adequately stocked with libations, sandwiches, and snacks to fuel the sea stories and scuttlebutt.

When we all gathered one morning in the hotel lobby for transportation to the Trident Training Facility (TTF) on the Bangor Submarine Base, some of my shipmates had aged significantly to the point where my youthful memory of them did not match those standing in front of me. The TTF tour brought back numerous memories, but the wet trainer was especially unforgettable. While in the USS Seawolf (SSN-21) dive trainer, I watched some of my conner shipmates drive erratically and into the bottom a couple times. It is all maneuvering by wire now and not the electro-hydraulic controls that were on the Sculpin. Later that day, we went up to the Keyport Museum only to find it closed due to the government shutdown. Nonetheless, it was not a complete bust. Outside of the museum, where the Trieste (DSV-1) and the Mystic (DSRV-1). It turned out that one of our group had served as the OIC of these vessels for a period of time. Bill Fultz LCDR, USN retired was a gawky, rather oblivious young torpedoman striker when I knew him on the Sculpin. Bill hoodwinked all of us. However, he spent the next hour walking us through the vessels systems and some of the adventures he encountered with these two vessels.

Our last gathering was at the "New Horse & Cow" in downtown Bremerton. We had the entire upper floor to ourselves. I only visited the "Horse & Cow" in Vallejo a couple of times and it will always be a place of legend. The new establishment is attempting to recapture that lore, but it is obvious from the bar's décor that it will reflect the new generation of submariners. Nevertheless, the libations flowed and so did the sea stories.

I walked away from this event with a couple of realities. First, as we toasted and remembered those Sculpin shipmates who are on eternal patrol, our numbers are slowly diminishing. This is a fact of life with our Perch Base membership also. We average about five members a year who depart on eternal patrol. Recruiting new members is a challenge. Which leads me to the second revelation. The 70s and 80s were years of great naval expansion which included adding many more submarines to the fleet. Most of us hail from this period. When Cold War ended, the draw down saw the decommissioning of many of the boats. Ergo, the number of qualified submariners has been and will continue to decrease. This will limit the availability of new members to recruit to Perch Base but also, USSVI in general.

The Perch Base BOD continues to wrestle with the challenge of recruiting new members. The BOD are not solely responsible recruiting new members. All the members have a duty and responsibility to recruit new member. Wear your submarine hat, decals on your vehicle, or get a veteran license plate with a submarine veteran license plate frame is a great start to start a conversation. Also, if you don't have a couple of meeting invitations cards in your wallet, then see the base commander and get some.

Norway buys more subs for 'turbulent times' in the North Atlantic

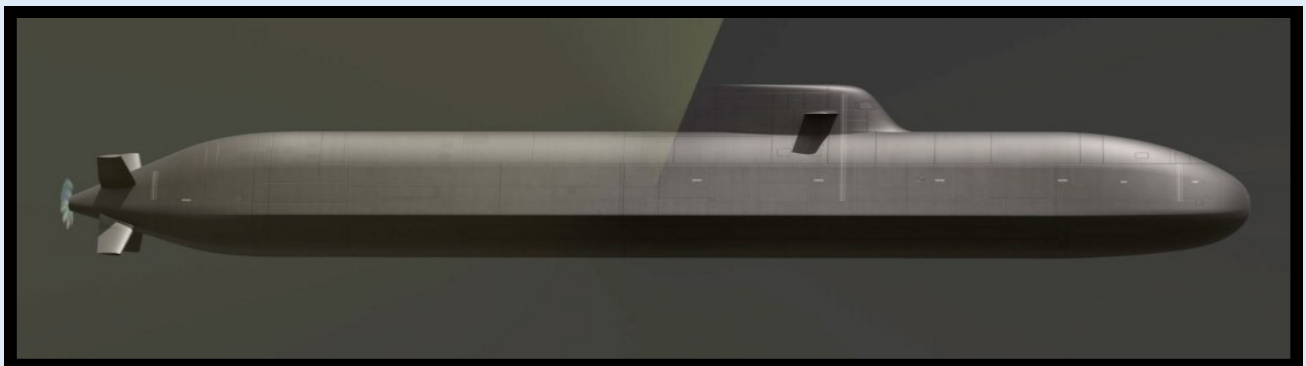
"We are a coastal and maritime nation and submarines are a crucial part of our defenses," says Defense Minister Tore O. Sandvik as the Nordic country announces the acquisition of another two subs from Germany's Thyssenkrupp Marine Systems.

Norway in 2021 [signed a contract](#) with the German yard for the building of four new submarines. This week, the country's Defense Minister announced that another two subs will be acquired.

"Submarines are an important strategic asset in Norwegian waters, helping to deter potential adversaries and strengthen the defense of Norwegian interests in turbulent times," Minister Tore O Sandvik says.

The Type 212CD class is based on Germany's Type 212 submarine class, but will be significantly larger. It will also feature a new stealth design. They are [designed for covert, shallow water operations](#).

"We are seeing increased activity from Russian forces in the North Atlantic and the Barents Sea," he explains. across the North Atlantic at any given time.

"It will have a strong deterrent effect on a potential adversary," Tore O. Sandvik says.

The acquisition comes at a high price. The current weapons race has resulted in a boost in defense construction costs.

The Defense Ministry is now calling on the Storting, the country's parliament, to approve a 46 billion kroner (€3,91 billion) extension of the submarine program.

The investments are to cover also the development of a new production line at the German yard.

Fifteen Perch Base members took the USS Phoenix float to the Annual Phoenix Veterans Day Parade presented by the non-profit Honoring America's Veterans (HAV) on November 11th. We received a **FIRST PLACE** trophy for the USS PHOENIX (SSN-702) float! **CONGRATULATIONS!**

It was an honoring experience that many of the other parade floats were business and community groups supporting veterans, but when groups like us with actual veterans on board passed by, the crowds lining the parade route really let out cheers and clapping!

We met at 8 AM to stage the float at the Firestone Complete Auto Care at 241 W Osborn Rd. Thanks to Firestone for letting us use your store lot (and bathroom!) and then rode the float to the parade starting point.

True to the military theme of "Hurry up and wait!" we arrived at the parade starting point at 9:34 AM, but as entry number 70 (of 91) we finally started to roll at 12:28 PM. This year's parade theme was "America, Our Guiding Light. Organizers anticipated 45,000 spectators along the parade route based on last year. The Celebrity Grand Marshall was Randy Couture and the Business Community Grand Marshal was Freddy Alvarez (a submariner). PEARL HARBOR REMEMBRANCE DAY

The event on 12/06/2025 at the Wesley Bolin Memorial Plaza by the Arizona State Capitol. We placed two wreaths, one for the WW2 Submarine Veterans and the other for the Perch Base Submarine Veterans.

The ceremony started with a commemorative flyover by World War II T-6 Texan Training Aircraft.

It is believed that fewer than 20 living Pearl Harbor survivors remain, none are left in Arizona and none of the USS Arizona (BB-39) survivors are still living. The Pearl Harbor Survivors' wreath in memory of those lost in the Pearl Harbor attack was placed by Dennis and Roberta Haskin, family members of Pearl Harbor Veteran Ed Miklavcic, who is physically unable to travel.

In the Spotlight



Perch Base Submarine Veterans (USSVI) can apply for a trip to Washington, DC from Honor Flight Arizona. Application forms are available on their website, www.honorflightaz.org. There are 124 Honor Flight hubs across the country, including Honor Flight Arizona. The cost to send a Veteran on the 3-day Honor Flight from Arizona is \$1,300 and includes airfare, hotel and food, but the Veteran pays nothing. The cost is covered by donations to the 501(c)(3) organization. Guardians that accompany a Veteran pay their own way. Spouses cannot be Guardians, but other family members are encouraged. They are presently sending mainly Korean and Vietnam War Veterans between 1941 to 1975, including Cold War Veterans. A recent flight (which included our Base Commander George Woods) that just returned on May 10, 2024, had 30 Veterans. The Honor Flight Arizona usually has 5 flights in the spring and 5 flights in the fall, but intends to increase to a total of 12 per year.

Tour activities included the US Navy Memorial, Fort McHenry, the National WW2 Memorial, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, the Marine Corp Memorial, Military Women's Memorial, Maryland Museum of Military History, the Changing of the Guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier and a group picture at Fort Myer Air Force Base. George Woods was highly complementary of his Honor Flight in 2024. Jim Andrews was on an Honor Flight in 2022.
